**Directions** - From Bramangarth, turn left and go 100 yards to 6 turnings. Turn right down the main route past the playing fields on your right. At the mini roundabout bear right and continue up through the village. 100m past the Lemon Arms, turn left and then immediately right. This is Bells Hill and you stay on this road for about 2 miles, going out of the village, along the top and straight through a crossroads (where you would turn right for Truro). Another few hundred yards on your left is the Cowshed, it will be well sign posted. Ample easy parking.

It is an easy and pretty walk ( approx. 1 mile) from the studio, down a quiet creek side road to the Harbour. There you will find a café, watersports centre, marina, chandlery and wine bar. Dogs are allowed on the beaches and you can even continue, through the fields, all the way round to Flushing village. Two more pubs and a café make a good spot to break your walk and there is an art exhibition in the village hall. The whole loop back to Church Rd is about 4 ½ miles.

The Pandora Inn is also worth a visit. A 16th century thatched building by the water, they are open all day.

Jacqueline and Lynn will be serving tea, real coffee and home made cakes. Children and dogs are welcome. There is plenty of parking and we hope you will visit our partner exhibitors at the Cowshed nearby (see map).

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
